1. Message from Kate Griffin, Interim CEO

I would like to thank the Head Teachers who provided such encouraging predictions recently.

If we achieve these results we shall be able to convince the RSC that our standards are improving rapidly. The RSC and her team met with the Board Friday last and at the beginning of the meeting she met with the Area Advisers. She wanted to meet them to obtain a view of how their work is impacting on schools and the progress of their pupils. She was clearly impressed by the work they are doing and this together with your predications and the results of the reviews that had been conducted by her educational specialists provide a very positive backdrop to the meeting which went on to discuss our options for governance in the future, the Conference planned for the 16th June at Exeter Race Course will be very important. 2. School Successes

<u>St John the Baptist School in Dartmouth</u> is celebrating their win at the Primary Maths Challenge.

On Tuesday 25th March Year 5 children from local primary schools joined forces to compete in a Maths Challenge. It was organised by the Head of Maths at Dartmouth Academy and was the first competition of its kind. There were 14 teams from 9 different schools and there were 3 challenging activities to solve. St John's team was made up of Ewan Chacksfield, Rachel Distin, Ben Lomas and Sarah Moseley.



All the children said - "We feel ecstatic and proud and have been taught well by all our teachers at St Johns." Rachel said "The best bit was when they announced our school had won especially as we weren't expecting to win."



From Special Measures to Good

We have had two schools that prior to conversion were judged to be in Special Measures. We are delighted that after their recent inspection St Paul's in Plymouth and Our Lady & St Patrick's have now been judged as good. We would like to send our congratulations to staff in both schools for this wonderful achievement.

Outlined on the next page are some of the comments from the Ofsted report.

St Paul's Catholic Primary School, Plymouth

The school has improved rapidly under the strong leadership of the new Headteacher and her team.

Teaching has improved and pupils are making rapid progress. The school's leaders have the confidence of governors, parents and pupils.

Governors have an in-depth knowledge of the school. They support and challenge the leadership on all areas of school improvement.

Teachers are very supportive of the changes made. The Headteacher has ensured that new, higher expectations are shared by nearly all staff.

Disadvantaged pupils receive good support and, in nearly all year groups and subjects, are making progress at a rate similar to other pupils.

Children in the Reception class get off to a good start. They enjoy coming to school and are well taught, so they are ready to move on to Year 1.

Pupils who have special educational needs and/or disabilities receive well-planned, targeted support and make good progress from their different starting points.

Teachers plan interesting lessons and activities and pupils enjoy their learning.

Teachers closely monitor progress and, supported by school leaders, give extra help to those who need to catch up.

Pupils are well behaved and pay attention in lessons. They have good attitudes to learning.

Arrangements for safeguarding are good. Pupils feel safe and know that adults will help and protect them.

A very large majority of pupils and parents say that bullying is rare but, if it does occur, is dealt with well by the school.

Our Lady & St Patrick's Catholic Primary School, Teignmouth

School leaders have a good understanding of the school. Their self-evaluation and plans for school improvement identify accurately areas in need of further development.

Governance is strong. Governors provide an appropriate balance of challenge and support

to senior leaders and understand what the school needs to do to improve further.

The quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good. Pupils develop a secure knowledge and understanding from their different starting points. They make good progress overall in English and mathematics.

Teachers and teaching assistants work well together to motivate pupils and ensure their good progress.

Pupils feel safe in school. They have positive relationships with staff and enjoy being at school.

Pupils' behaviour is good. Their attitudes to learning and school are positive. Pupils are confident and self-assured.

Leadership of the early years is good. Teachers have high expectations and a thorough knowledge of each child's individual needs and interests. As a result, children make good progress.

Parents are positive about the school. They confirm that outcomes for pupils are improving and that the school works effectively to keep their children safe.
